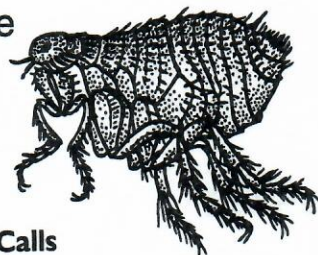


ALLERGIES (*Atopic Dermatitis*)

SAFE

- 1) Bathing - Twice a week or as often as needed. Use a bath oil after every bath.
- 2) Wipe paws with water or damp cloth every time he/she comes in from outside.
- 3) Clothing, socks, booties - Blocks allergens from getting on the skin.
- 4) Avoidance - Very difficult.
- 5) Shave dog - allows for easier and more effective skin care
- 6) Skin barriers - Essential 6 or allerderm
- 7) Fatty acids - Supplements or foods supplemented with it.
- 8) Flush eyes if eyes are itchy.

ESSENTIAL



Must control secondary infections. Tests to diagnose these are:

- 1) Bacteria/Yeast cytology (slides under microscope)
- 2) Parasitic - Skin scrapes or Revolution
- 3) Fungal - Culture
- 4) Flea control year round.

TREATMENTS

- 1) Antihistamines
- 2) Cortisone - Good short term, can have side effects.
- 3) Atopica - Good long term, can have side effects.
- 4) Topical cortisone spray - Can have side effects.
- 5) Topical bacterial spray
- 6) If year round allergies must do food trial to rule out food allergies.
- 7) Blood test and shots - less expensive but can miss some allergies.
- 8) Skin testing and shots - Gold standard, effective about 70% of the time.

Signs:
Ringworm can appear as areas of
circular hair loss, broken hairs, scaling,
pustules and intense pruritus.
Malassezia is a yeast infection most
common in dogs. It causes "yeasty"
smelly skin and haircoat and can
occur with bacterial infection as well.
